Consistency of terms. As identified, this is a swiftly moving topic which is also highly charged. As I understand it, LGBTQ+ should be consistently used. The order of the letters should not imply that one form of identity is 'superior' to others. Likewise when referring to bullying, homophobic bullying is referenced, but not the full range of identity. Arguably, those that are Trans experience bullying at the highest levels.
