Keeping you safe: our Child Protection Policy



What is Safeguarding about?

All of the adults around you think that your health, safety and welfare are very important.

In our school, we respect our children and help to protect their rights.

We do our best to help children make good educational progress.

We teach children how to recognise risks in different situations, and how to protect themselves and stay safe. We learn about these in assemblies and in PSHE.

We make sure school is a safe place for everyone, and that everyone feels welcome.

Safeguarding is all the things we do to help keep you safe!

How will we try to protect children?

We want to make sure that children remain safe, at home as well as at school.

We want you to know where to get help if they are worried or unhappy about something.

Tell a grown up if someone is:

- Bullying you.
- Saying things you do not like and which upset you.
- Touching you in private places
- Trying to give you tablets, cigarettes, drugs or alcohol.

- Hitting you or hurting you
- Taking your things.
- Saying or sending unkind things to you over the internet or on your mobile phone or tablet
- Doing or saying things that make you feel uncomfortable.
- Not looking after you or caring for you properly.

If you need to talk – we will listen and we can help!

You can talk to any adult in school - your teacher, or anyone that helps in school if you need to. It is Mrs Taylor and Mrs Wright's special job to keep you safe – talk to them if you are worried.
